
Abraham Joshua Heschel

(January 11, 1907 – December 23, 1972)



Timeline

January 11, 1907, born in Warsaw, Poland, youngest of six children, to Rabbi Moshe Mordecai Heschel and Reizel Perlow Heschel; considered a blessed genius as a child

1916, father dies of influenza

1927, successfully completes his examinations at the Mathematical-Natural Science Gymnasium in Vilna **1933,** obtains doctorate from the University of Berlin; releases his first book, a collection of poems,

1934, ordained as a rabbi

The Ineffable Name of God: Man

1937, appointed by Martin Buber as Buber's successor at Lehrhaus in Frankfurt

October, 1938, arrested by the Nazis; deported to Poland; dies in his sleep, on the Sabbath, teaches at Warsaw Institute for Jewish Studies; immigrates to England

1940, immigrates to the U.S.; Assoc. Prof. of Philosophy and Rabbinics at Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati

1941-1945, sister Esther killed in a German bombing; mother murdered by the Nazis; sisters, Gittel and Devorah, die in Nazi concentration camps

1945, becomes Professor of Jewish Ethics and Mysticism at Jewish Theological Seminary, NYC

December 10, 1946, marries Sylvia Straus, in LA, CA

May 6, 1956, birth of daughter, Susannah Heschel

1962-1965, first officially recognized Jewish advisor for

Second Vatican Council

March 21, 1965, walks and demonstrates with Martin Luther King in the Selma to Montgomery march

Fall 1965, helps to co-found Clergy and Laity Concerned

about the Vietnam War (CALCVW)

Shabbat, December 23, 1972,

considered in Judaism as "kiss from God"

Dec. 24, 1972, funeral held at Park West Memorial Chapel, 115 W. 79th St., NYC; buried at Beth David Cemetery, Elmont, Nassau County, New York




























A Few of Heschel's Memorable Quotes


- "My feet were praying."

- Human beings are "to live a life that would deserve and evoke an eternal Amen."



The measure of Heschel's Greatness

In the 20th century few religious figures in Judaism loomed larger or had greater impact than Abraham Joshua Heschel. In his brief 65 years of life, spent on two continents, he combined the knowledge of a genius intellectual with the passion of a prophet and the lyricism of a poet. His is a monumental legacy of magisterial importance.

- Scholarly work on the Hebrew prophets
- Passion for and sensitive engagement with interfaith dialogue
- Reveling in the joys and challenges of Hasidic mysticism
- Descriptions of authentic worship
- Emphasis on the hallowing the Sabbath
- Social justice activism on behalf of human rights for all people

Heschel's grandest contributions are in his thinking, teaching, and writing about the fundamental dynamics of humanity's relationship with God.

- All of life is holy and every human soul is precious.
- God importunes humanity to be representative of God's presence in the world.
- Faith begins in reverential awe.
- Prayer is constituted by practice and devotion to an unwavering principle: "Just to be is a blessing. Just to live is holy." Prayer is also "subversive," in that it stimulates us "to overthrow and to ruin the pyramids of callousness, hatred, opportunism, falsehood."
- The Sabbath is a "sanctuary in time" by which we become "attuned to holiness in time....to the mystery of creation...."


