
Dietrich Bonhoeffer

(February 4, 1906 – April 9, 1945



<u>Timeline</u>

February 4, 1906, born, with twin sister, Sabine, in Breslau, Germany, 2 of 8 of Karl Bonhoeffer and Paula (von Hase) Bonhoeffer **1912**, family moves to Berlin **1919**, announces he will become a theologian Mar. 15, 1921, confirmed at Grunewald Church, Berlin; grows up comfortably bourgeois **1927**, doctorate at Univ. of Berlin, at age 21 1928, vicar of German Lutheran ch. in Barcelona **1930-1931**, postgraduate year at Union Theological Seminary (NYC)(including work at Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem) International Friendship through the Churches Aug. 1931, lecturer in theology at U. of Berlin Nov. 1931, ordained, St. Matthias Church, Berlin

Jan.30, 1933, Adolf Hitler, Reich Chancellor Feb. 1, 1933, Bonhoeffer's radio talk "Changes in the Concept of the Leader Principle" is cut off air before completion **1933**, gives final lecture courses at Berlin Sept.7, 1933, collaborates with Martin Niemoeller to organize Pastors' Emergency League, 2000 Lutheran pastors opposed to the control of state church by Nazis; pastor of German Evang. Church, Sydenham, & Ref. Church of St. Paul in London May 1934, Confessing Church organizes, Barmen, Germany

 Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem)
1931, Youth Sec. of World Alliance for Promoting International Friendship through the Churches
Aug. 1931, lecturer in theology at U. of Berlin
Nov. 1931, ordained, St. Matthias Church, Berlin
1935, assumes leadership of the Confessing Church's clandestine seminary at Zingsthof by the Baltic Sea, relocated later to Finkenwalde (Pomerania)
Aug. 15, 1936, preaches at Olympic Village, after which U.of Berlin faculty authorization withdrawn

Timeline (continued)

Oct.1937, Gestapo closes Finckenwalde Sem. **1938**, part of Abwehr resistance circle (courier and diplomat to the British government) 1940--1943, between activities for resistance, works *Ethics* at Ettal (Benedictine monastery) Jan. 17, 1943, engaged, Maria von Wedemeyer **1943**, tries to help Jews escaping to Switzerland April 5, 1943, arrested and imprisoned July 20, 1944, failed Hitler assassination attempt Oct. 8, 1944, transferred to cellar of Gestapo prison in Prinz Albrecht Strasse Feb. 5, 1945, transferred to Buchenwald April 3-8, 1945, moved to Regensberg, Schonborg, and eventually Flossenburg April 9, 1945, executed by hanging, on Himmler's orders; unknown burial place

April 30, 1945, Hitler commits suicide in Führerbunker, beneath Reich Chancellery buildings in Berlin, July 27, 1945, memorial services for Bonhoeffer held at Holy Trinity Church, London, encouraged by Bishop of Chichester April 9, 1946, memorial service held in Berlin; memorial in Dorotheenstadt cemetery, Berlin **1951**, first German edition of prison letters published as Widerstand und Ergebung (*Resistance and Submission*) **1953**, first English edition of prison letters published as **Prisoner for God** and later as Letters and Papers from Prison 1973, International Bonhoeffer Society -**English Language Section founded** 2015, The Bonhoeffer Center website begins




Bonhoeffer's Catchphrases: A Legacy to Live By

- **"A world come of age"** his description of the world's complexities, including radical evil
- "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die" how he described the call of faith and the risk of conversion, a death to old ways of living life (i.e. ignoring the needs of neighbors & Jesus' example as premier guidance for action
- **"Cheap Grace"** what Bonhoeffer warned against, urging instead an embrace of **"Costly Discipleship"**
- **"The Psalms are Jesus' Prayerbook"** what he taught "underground seminary" students and untold readers of his book on the Psalms

Bonhoeffer on Praying the Psalms

• The Psalms reflect life in all of its fullness and complexities, all of its exhilarating joys and disappointing defeats.



- The Psalms are important because Jesus prayed them.
- The Psalms are to be prayed so we can begin to understand how to pray in the name of Jesus Christ.

Bonhoeffer on Prayer



- Prayer is ultimately personal, always tinged
- with intimate connections, the way a child's life is bound to a parent.
- Prayer connects us within the human community.
- For Christians, prayer is made possible by Jesus Christ (Cf. Rom. 8:26)
- Jesus's instructions and exemplary prayer for his first disciples show subsequent followers how to pray.
- Prayer is a prime source for enduring.
- By steeping oneself in prayer and meditation one more fully becomes a bearer of God's Word.

Bonhoeffer's Challenging Example

• Engaged in an interior struggle "WHO AM I?"

....Who am I? This or the other? Am I one person today and tomorrow another? Am I both at once? A hypocrite before others, and before myself a contemptibly woebegone weakling? Or is something within me still like a beaten army, fleeing in disorder from victory already achieved?

Who am I? They mock me, these lonely questions of mine? Whoever I am, thou knowest, O God, I am thine.



Bonhoeffer's Challenging Example ... continued

• "Good and Evil" are not the primary enemies of living responsibly and wisely; the primary enemy is "Folly."

"Neither protests nor force can touch it; reasoning is no use; facts that contradict personal prejudices can simply be disbelieved — indeed, the fool can counter by criticizing them, and if they are undeniable, they can just be pushed aside as trivial exceptions. So the fool, as distinct from the scoundrel, is completely self-satisfied.... One feels...when talking to him, that one is dealing, not with the man himself, but with slogans, catchwords, and the like, which have taken hold of him. He is under a spell..."



Bonhoeffer's Challenging Example ... continued



- Resistance to Hitler & the Nazis: Theological, Ecclesial, Political, Existential
- Bonhoeffer has been used, misused, and abused
 - -- e.g. Pat Robertson (re: Chavez assassination), Paul Hill (bombing abortion clinic)
- Bonhoeffer's "big (heroic) life" compared to ours -- . (Do we really have to do something "big" to engage in righteous morality?)
- The "What If's" Abound

What if he hadn't been murdered and martyred? What if he had lived and shown the world a new way? **The only real question we actually can answer**: What if we lived differently because of what we have learned from his example?
